



## Sailing Instructions (SI)

## Marstrand Big Boat Race 2022 (MBBR)

**Dates:** May 20th – 22nd 2022

**Location:** Marstrand

**Boat classes:** The competition is open to all boats with SRS or SRSv

1,0 and higher.

Organizing authority: Marstrands SS, (below shortened to MaSS)

in cooperation with BLUR

#### 1. Rules

1.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021 – 2024 and the class rules for single hull boats according to the SRS (Swedish Respite System).
SRS is the Swedish Sailing Federation's Rating System for keelboats, multihulls, and dinghies

1.2 The race committee may use VHF radio to provide information to the fleet. Failure to make this broadcast or failure to hear the broadcast shall not be grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 62.1. Information about the VHF channel will be given at the skippers meeting.

### 2. Changes to the Sailing Instructions

2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the official notice board not later than one hour before the warning signal of a race. The official noticeboard is at:

The race committee will also try to put the same information on a noticeboard close to the H-jetty, but this is not a rule.

#### 3. Time schedule

3.1 Races are scheduled according to the program as follows:

#### 4. The start

4.1 The starting procedure will be as shown below, this changes RRS 26.

Minutes before starting signal	Visual signal	Sound signal	Means
At least 10	Orange flag	One long	Starting line in place
5	Class flag	One	Warning signal
4	P, I, U or black flag	One	Preparatory signal
1	Preparatory flag removed	One long	One minute
0	Class flag removed	One	Starting signal

4.2 If several classes / groups are started one after the other, the orange flag is displayed all the time

### 4.3 Class flag



= F Boats ≥12m



= D Boats <12m

4.4 The race committee will try to call the sail number on a boat that has started early, on VHF channel 72 or what has been told at the skippers briefing.

Any omission by the race committee is not grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1a.

- 4.5 A boat starting more than five minutes after the starting signal will be scored as did not start (DNS)
- 4.6 To alert boats that a new starting sequence is about to begin, the orange flag on the starting line will be displayed with a sound signal not less than five minutes before the warning signal.


#### 5. The Course

5.1 The courses are as described below:






# This designed course applies only for boats ≥12m







# This designed course applies only for boats <12m





#### 6. Marks

- 6.2 The starting line is between a pole with an orange flag on the starting vessel and a buoy with a pole with an orange flag.
- 6.3 The finishing line will be between a pole with a blue flag on the committee boat and a buoy with a pole with a blue flag.
- 6.4 The rounding mark no. 1 is a "Jumbo" =



2A, 2B, 3 are yellow buoys =



1A is a red buoy

4 is a buoy with an orange flag, e.g the same as in the starting sequence

#### 7.0 Time limits

- 7.1 The race committee will try to set the course so that a race will take approximately 60 minutes to sail.
- 7.2 The time limit for the first boat to finish is 90 minutes.
- 7.3 A boat that does not finish within 30 minutes after the first boat has finished, will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF). This changes RRS 35.

#### 8. Reporting

8.1 A boat that does not start or retires, shall inform the race committee as soon as possible on telephone +46 (0)705803160 or by e-mail peter@soderbergfastigheter.se

#### 9. Protests and requests for hearings

- 9.1 Protests and request for hearings shall be filed at the race office within the protest time limit and comply with the requirements of RRS 61.2.
- 9.2 The time limit for protest is 30 minutes and is calculated from the time the boats had a reasonable opportunity to sail in from the track and moor. This changes the App. S 13.2
- 9.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after all involved boats have finished or stopped racing. Call for hearing may also be e-mailed to the parties.



## 10. Scoring

10.1 The low point scoring system of RRS A will apply, modified so that when three or fewer races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
